## **People Working Cooperatively appoints William Johnson Jr. and Stephanie Lambers to Board**

**CINCINNATI** – People Working Cooperatively (PWC), a local nonprofit that provides critical home repair, weatherization, modification and maintenance services to help low-income residents stay safely in their homes, announced the appointment of two new members to the Board of Directors, Bill Johnson Jr. and Stephanie Lambers.

Bill Johnson was the former Manager of the Housing and Neighborhood Development for the city of Dayton before he retired. Bill has been instrumental in bringing People Working Cooperatively to Dayton. Bill recommended PWC to the Dayton Fund when the needs in Dayton began to grow larger than the Dayton Fund could manage. Of the partnership, Bill Johnson said “I know there will be so many more people helped and able to stay in their homes due to PWC.”
