## **People Working Cooperatively (PWC) Seeking Volunteers for 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Repair Affair Event**

*Volunteers to Help Local Homeowners with Critical Repairs*

**Cincinnati, OH**– People Working Cooperatively is seeking skilled volunteers for 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Repair Affair event on Saturday, May 9 from 8:30am to 3pm. PWC staff members and volunteers will provide critical home repairs for low-income, elderly and disabled homeowners throughout the Greater Cincinnati region.

Skilled volunteers are needed to help complete extensive repairs. Those in the community with experience in roofing, general carpentry, plumbing or electrical work are strongly encouraged to volunteer.

“In celebration of our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we set a goal of repairing 40 homes,” said Aaron Grant, volunteer manager at People Working Cooperatively. “We need volunteers to make that goal happen! If you’re handy around the house, please consider donating your time to your community.”

Repair Affair is PWC’s annual spring volunteer event that provides help to low-income, elderly and disabled homeowners with the home repairs they need to keep their home safe and livable. Projects range in complexity from rebuilding a porch to fixing doorbells and installing ramps.

During last year’s Repair Affair, more than 800 volunteers from around the community assisted 81 homeowners. Repair Affair teams will be comprised of individuals, families, businesses and community groups.
