What: PWC's 33rd Annual Repair Affair spring volunteer event, providing home repairs and modifications to low-income, elderly and disabled homeowners in Greater Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky and Southern Indiana.

When: Saturday, May 9
8:30am – 3pm

Where: Volunteers will report directly to the home of the PWC client they are assigned.

Description: In celebration of PWC's 40th year of service to residents of Greater Cincinnati, staff and volunteers will help to repair 40 homes.

Repair Affair is PWC's annual spring volunteer event, providing home repairs and modifications that enable low-income, elderly and disabled residents to remain safely in their homes. Individuals, businesses and community groups can volunteer for a day (in some cases, more than one day) to help a client with various home repair needs, ranging from the simple - fixing handrails and installing grab bars; to the more extensive - home modifications for the disabled, ramps, drywall, etc. During last year's Repair Affair, more than 800 volunteers from around the community assisted 81 homeowners.
