People Working Cooperatively (PWC) Presents 35th Annual Repair Affair

Cincinnati, OH- People Working Cooperatively is seeking skilled volunteers for their 35th annual Repair Affair event on Saturday, May 13 starting at 8:30 am. Volunteer crews will provide critical home repairs and modifications for 50 low-income, elderly and disabled homeowners throughout the Greater Cincinnati region.

PWC is looking for individuals and small groups with home repair skills who can provide their own tools, and have at least four hours to commit to a minor home repair project. Those in the community with experience in roofing, general carpentry, plumbing or electrical work are strongly encouraged to volunteer.

“Each spring, our annual Repair Affair event brings thousands of volunteers together to make a big impact in our community,” said Aaron Grant, Volunteer Program Manager at People Working Cooperatively. “This year, we hope to make necessary and critical home repairs for 50 of our low-income neighbors all across Greater Cincinnati, but we need help to reach our goal. If you are skilled and able, please consider donating your time and expertise on May 13.”

Repair Affair is PWC’s annual volunteer event that provides low-income, elderly and disabled homeowners with the home repairs they need to keep their home safe. Projects range in complexity from installing handrails and repairing drywall to fixing leaky plumbing and repairing steps.

During last year’s Repair Affair, more than 400 volunteers donated more than 2,000 total hours to serve 60 homeowners. Repair Affair teams will be comprised of individuals, families, corporate and community groups.
