Throughout the month of November, nearly 2,000 volunteers of all ages and skill levels will be pulling on their work gloves and giving of their time by raking leaves, cleaning gutters and pulling weeds at the homes of seniors, veterans and people with disabilities living on low or fixed incomes to help prepare their yards for the winter months.

"Tasks like raking leaves or cleaning gutters may seem like a simple weekend chore for you or me, but for a homeowner who can't physically manage them, it's an incredible gift. During Prepare Affair, we're able to not only improve the look of these homes and yards but also help restore pride for the homeowners and create a meaningful, lasting impact in our community."

The main participation day for Prepare Affair is Saturday, Nov. 15, and lunch will be provided back at PWC's headquarters in Bond Hill. If volunteers aren't available that day, they are invited to schedule their service on any day in November that works best for them.
