People Working Cooperatively secures funding support for critical home services

Grant funding empowers nonprofit to implement repair and modification services for safer, healthier homes for underserved residents

CINCINNATI (August 7, 2025) – [People Working Cooperatively \(PWC\)](#), a nonprofit that provides professional critical home repair, weatherization, and accessibility modification services for low-income neighbors in communities throughout Greater Cincinnati, has announced that it is the recipient of eight grants to help continue its mission.

The grants include:

- **Don and Phyllis Neyer** awarded a Charitable Gift Fund of \$65,000 for the Healthy Homes initiative.
- **Fifth Third Bank** awarded \$5,000 for workforce development. These funds will allow for better trades/construction training and education offered through PWC.
- **Google's Ohio Grid Innovation Fund** awarded an undisclosed amount, which will go toward energy efficiency, workforce development and other services.
- **Health Path Foundation** awarded \$25,000 to further aid in PWC's mission of keeping people healthy and safe in their homes.
- **Macy's** awarded \$13,000 for PWC's Modifications for Mobility program, which helps target complicated home modification projects to aid some of the organization's most vulnerable clients.
- **The R.C. Durr Foundation** awarded funding for home repairs and modifications in Northern Kentucky.
- **S.C. Ministry Foundation** awarded \$100,000 to be used for home repairs and modifications on homes located throughout Price Hill.
- **U.S. Bank Charitable Foundation** awarded \$25,000 for home repairs and modifications.

"We are incredibly grateful to these generous organizations for supporting our mission to restore homes—and restore pride—in our underserved communities," said Chris Owens, Vice President of Development at PWC. "Each grant we receive empowers us to expand our critical home repair and modification services for neighbors who need it most, which includes veterans, single parents, grandparents raising grandchildren, and individuals living with disabilities. We're celebrating our fiftieth anniversary this year, and

with support from orgs like these, PWC will be able to help even more families in the next 50 years.”
